## **Benefits**

Duration of ESR Fellowships: 36 months.

Salary (inclusive of Italy allowance): €37,000 to €50,000 per annum gross, depending on the ESR Fellow's circumstances.

Start date: April 2017

## **Eligibility criteria**

- At the time of their recruitment, candidates must not have legally resided or have had their main activity (work, studies, etc.) in Italy for more than 12 months in the last 3 years (short stays such as holidays are not counted)
- Eligible applicants must be in the first 4 years (full-time equivalent) of their research career and not yet have been awarded a doctoral degree. This is measured from the date when they obtained the Master's degree which would formally entitle them to embark on a doctorate.
- During their research, the candidates must accept to be seconded in partner organizations as scheduled in their research description.
- Whilst researchers of any nationality can apply for this scheme, please note that the ESR Fellowships only cover the fee levels for EU citizens, not those for students from outside the EU. Non-EU applicants will have to cover the shortfall for the international PhD fees.
- Applicable laws and regulations follow the European Commission criteria for recruitment for this type of funding under ITN Marie Curie actions ([http://ec.europa.eu/research/participants/data/ref/h2020/other/guides\\_for\\_applicants/h2020-guide-appl16-msca-itn\\_en.pdf](http://ec.europa.eu/research/participants/data/ref/h2020/other/guides_for_applicants/h2020-guide-appl16-msca-itn_en.pdf) )
- Languages required: English (excellent), Italian (basic)

## **Selection process**

### **Application procedure**

- Applicants should send a CV (max 2 pages), a cover letter (1 page) specifying the research theme selected and outlining why they are suitable for the position and the names of two referees. A short description of the proposed research project (max 2500 words) must also be part of the application: this should include an abstract of max. 200 words and a project proposal – specifying research question(s), positioning in the relevant academic debate(s), the proposed methodology and a work

plan. Applications for more than one position are allowed. The research proposals must relate directly to one of the 15 ESRs described. Application documents must be submitted directly to the host institution, no later than the 16th January 2017.
